## **E.A.B. KILLS ASH**



You may have noticed ash trees in Minneapolis that have been marked with green ribbon. These trees have been marked to raise awareness about impending changes that Emerald Ash Borer (E.A.B.) will bring to our urban forest. E.A.B. is an invasive beetle that is killing ash trees in Minneapolis.



### What is Emerald Ash Borer (E.A.B.)?

E.A.B. is an invasive beetle that kills ash trees (*Fraxinus* spp.). The destructive potential of E.A.B. is enormous because there is currently no known cure. It was found in Minneapolis in 2010.

### What will happen to the ash trees?

All ash trees (including the trees marked with ribbon) will become infested with E.A.B. and eventually die. The approaching loss of ash trees will cause a drastic change to the urban forest in Minneapolis. Because the population of E.A.B. is increasing, the Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board (MPRB) has developed a canopy replacement plan that provides for the scheduled replacement of ash trees.

### What is the canopy replacement plan?

The purpose of the plan is to reduce the impact of canopy loss while growing a diverse and resilient forest for future generations. The MPRB intends to reduce the impact of losses by gradually replacing publically owned ash trees.

### Will all public ash trees be removed at once?

No. We want to reduce the impact of ash tree canopy loss. Based on recommendations from the Minneapolis Tree Advisory Commission, we hope to remove no more than 20% of existing tree canopy on a block during a single season.

In parks, where space permits, we are also planting "buddy" trees near existing ash trees to start growing the next canopy.

### Can I request to have my boulevard ash tree replaced?

Yes! If you would like to beat the beetle, you may take action to have the boulevard ash tree adjacent to your property replaced by simply filing out the provided form and mailing it to us. The form is also available online at <a href="https://www.minneapolisparks.org/eab">www.minneapolisparks.org/eab</a>. This is a free service for publically owned ash trees.

### Can I treat a public boulevard ash tree with insecticide?

Yes. If you would like to treat a boulevard ash tree adjacent to your property with insecticide, please visit: www.minneapolisparks.org/eab for a list of licensed and permitted tree care companies. Homeowners are required to pay for any and all treatments.

### What about the ash tree in my yard?

If you'd like to replace or treat your private ash tree, you may want to consult an arborist. Please visit www.minneapolisparks.org/eab for a list of licensed and permitted tree care companies, as well as a guide to homeowner considerations.
